

She is interested in arts and music.

Personal qualities, traits '-ing'

Karen is an annoying person.
The lecture was exciting.

ADJECTIVE RULES

Adjectives do not take the plural form:

- (XXX) The blues shirts are more expensive.
- The blue shirts are more expensive.

Don't use 'very' with strong adjectives:

- 🖾 I was very delighted to meet them.
- (v) I was absolutely delighted to meet them.

Order of adjectives in a sentence:

opinion, size, shape, age, color¹, origin, material, purpose
